### **Summary**

The initiative has been realized by ARSIA in collaboration with Province of Pistoia and GAL (Local Action Group) Garfagnana.

The technical meeting was finalized to show the results of the feasibility study about the Biomass Logistic and Trade Centre closed to Campotizzoro (PT), among involved partners.

The technical meeting has been addressed to help Province of Pistoia to prepare a proposal to realize and manage a BT&LC in Campotizzoro for the call for bids made by GAL Garfagnana.

At the meeting were present delegates from the Province of Pistoia, from GAL Garfagnana, from the A.R.Bo (the Tuscany forest operators association), from the Cooperative Bosco Domani (forest and agricultural owners cooperative) and from ARSIA. All the economical results and the technical assessment were presented and some financial problems were analysed.

Beside that, ARSIA took the occasion to present the new catalogue about wood fuels producers, realized within the BTC Project, and several copies of the catalogue and of the wood fuels handbook were distributed to the participants.

### **List of participants**

The initiative was open only to the institutions and to the subjects interested to BL&TC and working in the local area of Appennino Pistoiese. According to the registrations about 10 people have taken part to the technical meeting: 4 belong to the administration of the Province of Pistoia, 1 to the A.R.Bo (association of forest operators), 2 from ARSIA, 1 from GAL Garfagnana and 1 from the Cooperative Bosco Domani.
